2003 Vintage

90 Points - The Truchard's vineyards fall within a transition zone between Carneros and Mt. Veeder, where it's warm enough to fully ripen cabernet, but not so warm that the grapes lose their cool, juicy cherry flavor, firm tannin and mineral edge of acidity. These elements create a simple wine with impressive restraint, delicious with grilled lamb chops.. – *Wine & Spirits*

2002 Vintage

Four Stars ★ ★ ★ ★ deep nose, some lifted hazelnut oak. Tight, spicy, lovely raspberry fruit, good balance. 2-10 years.— *Decanter*

1999 Vintage

91 Points - Beautiful aromatics, with ripe plum, currant, floral, spice and cedary notes. Turns supple and polished, with touches of herb, bell pepper, sage and mineral. Ripe, well-integrated tannins show through on the finish. Drink now through 2010. – *Wine Spectator*

1997 Vintage

94 Points - For the money, Cabernet doesn't get any better than this. And it comes from Carneros of all places. Dark, minty and chocolaty, with a richness that carries into and through the blackberry palate. It's got plenty of girth and size, but also perfect balance and grace. 92 Points - Weaves together a complex range of earthy currant, coffee, toffee, sage, toasty oak and vanilla bean, turning supple and polished. Finishes with a long, intricate aftertaste. - *Wine Spectator*
